Tenório was also Vice President of the New Club of Paris, a think tank on knowledge economy. She holds a degree in Economics and a master's degree in Economics from the Federal University of Rio de Janeiro (UFRJ), an MBA from the Federal University of Rio de Janeiro's Graduate Institute of Business Administration, and a postgraduate degree in Digital Transformation from PUC-Rio.



#### José Pio Borges

José Pio Borges is Chairman of the Board of Trustees at the Brazilian Center for International Relations (CEBRI), Member of the Board of Directors of Finvest and Member of the Strategic Council of Casa Firjan. He is Director of Casa Stefan Zweig in Petrópolis and President of the Council of Fundação Eva Klabin, among others. Pio Borges was President of the Brazilian National Bank for Economic and Social Development (BNDES), where he also served as Vice-President after holding several other positions. He has also served as President of Pronor Petroquímica, Director of BBM Bank and Board Member of Petrobras Directors, Cia. Vale do Rio Doce, Aracruz Celulose SA, COPESUL, Rede Ferroviária Federal AS, Banco do Nordeste do Brasil

SA, USIMINAS, among others. Pio Borges holds a Master's degree in Economics from the New School for Social Research in New York, a Bachelor's degree in Mechanical Engineering and a Master's degree in Industrial Engineering from the Pontifical Catholic University of Rio de Janeiro. Pio Borges has received many honors and decorations, such as the Rodrigo Melo Franco de Andrade Award from Brazilian Institute of National Historic Preservation (IPHAN); the Grande Medalha da Inconfidência, from the State of Minas Gerais; Man of the Year in the National Scene, from the Rio de Janeiro Stock Exchange; Medal of Industrial Honor from the Federation of Industries of Rio de Janeiro (FIRJAN); Citizen of the State of Bahia, from the Bahia State Legislative Assembly; and the Sergio Gregory Medal of Honor from the Friends of the National Museum.



#### **Marcia Loureiro**

On July 12, 2021, Ambassador Marcia Loureiro was appointed as President of the Alexandre de Gusmão Foundation (FUNAG), which is affiliated to the Brazilian Ministry of Foreign Affairs, A career diplomat, she entered the Rio Branco Institute (IRBr) in 1985. She holds a Master of Science Degree in Foreign Service (1993) from the Edmund A. Walsh School of Foreign Service, Georgetown University, Washington-DC/USA. In Brazil, Ambassador Loureiro worked in the areas of trade promotion, science and technology, diplomatic planning, federative and parliamentary relations, economic organizations, and the fight against transnational crime. She was also a member of the National Organizing Committee of the Rio+20 Conference, and Head Advisor for International Affairs at the Ministry of Justice from 2015 to 2017. Abroad, she served at the Embassy in Lima, was Deputy Consul in Boston, Deputy Consul General in San Francisco, Deputy Head of Mission at the Embassy in Washington, and Consul General in Los Angeles from 2017 to 2021.



#### Luciana Mendes Santos Servo

Civil servant in the Institute for Applied Economic Research - Ipea since 1998, with the attributions of conducting research, evaluations and being a public policy advisor. She holds a PhD in Economics from the Federal University of Minas Gerais (Cedeplar/UFMG) and a Master's degree, also in Economics, from the University of São Paulo (FEA/USP), with specialization in health economics. Employed at the Institute since 1998, she has authored numerous studies on health financing and expenditure, healthcare accounts, monitoring and analysis of public health policies, labor market, and regional economics. She has conducted and coordinated evaluations, including those related to the Council for Monitoring and Evaluation of Public Policies (CMAP).



#### **Lucas Padilha**

Lucas Padilha is a lawyer specializing in economic law and international relations who graduated from the Getúlio Vargas Foundation's School of Law and School of Social Sciences in São Paulo. He is Municipal Secretary of the Civil House of Rio de Janeiro City Hall. He was Secretary for the Environment, Chief of Staff of the Civil House and Special Coordinator for International Relations at Rio de Janeiro City Hall and special advisor to the São Paulo State Department of Education. With a Master's degree in Law and Society from Peking University, where he was a Yenching Scholar, Padilha was a fellow of Legado, a leadership program devised by former President Fernando Henrique Cardoso, and is the first Brazilian in the Club de Madrid's network of young political leaders, the world's largest network of former heads of state and government.



#### Clarissa Lins

Trustee at the Brazilian Center of International Relations (CEBRI), Clarissa Lins is the Founder of Catavento Consultoria, created in August 2013. From November 2019 to March 2021, Lins was President of the Brazilian Petroleum, Gas and Biofuels Institute (IBP), where she was also Executive Director between 2016 and 2019. She is a member of Suzano's Sustainability Committee since August 2019 and the World Economic Forum's Global Future Council on the Future of Energy since September 2018. She was a member of Petrobras's Board of Directors between May 2018 and December 2019, an independent member of the Sustainability Committee of Vale's Board of Directors between May 2017 and December 2019 and Executive Director of the Brazilian Foundation for Sustainable Development between 2004 and 2013. She worked in the public sector for several years, at the Ministry of Finance (1993-94), at Brazil's National Bank for Economic and Social Development (BNDES) as special advisor to the Presidency (1995-99) and at Petrobras, as special advisor to the Presidency and Executive Manager of Corporate Strategy (1999-2002). Lins obtained both her bachelor's and master's degrees in Economics from the Pontifical Catholic University of Rio de Janeiro (PUC-Rio).





#### Céline Kauffmann

Her mission is to support the continued development of IDDRI and help ensure its impacts and relevance through strategic guidance and planning, enhanced dialogue with stakeholders and international partnerships. Céline Kauffmann was previously at the OECD, where she started her career in 2001 and held various positions over the years as an economist and senior manager on a range of issues of relevance to sustainable development. In particular, she has led several policy-relevant initiatives. established stakeholder platforms, and held ministerial discussions, on greening the business sector, green investment, international governance, and water. In 2020-2023, she led the OECD Division on Entrepreneurship, SME and Tourism where she spearheaded work on greening SMEs, green entrepreneurship and sustainable finance. Previously, she was Deputy Head of the Regulatory Policy Division where she led work on international regulatory cooperation among others. Before that, she was responsible for green investment in the OECD Investment Division. She joined the OECD in 2001 to coordinate and author the African Economic Outlook joint flagship report of the OECD Development Centre and the African Development Bank. Before the OECD, Céline Kauffmann contributed to the 2000 Transition Report of the European Bank for Reconstruction and Development. #### **Luciana Costa**

Luciana has a degree in Economics from the State University of Campinas (Unicamp) and a master's degree in Finance from the Getulio Vargas Foundation (SP) and the University of Chicago in the United States. Before joining the BNDES, she worked for more than 25 years in the private financial market, at banks such as BankBoston, Citibank, ABN AMRO Real, Standard Bank and, most recently, at Natixis (Groupe BPCE), where she was the president of its subsidiary in Brazil.



#### Maria Netto Schneider

Maria Netto is the Executive Director of the Institute for Climate and Society. She worked at the Inter-American Development Bank (IDB) as a Principal Specialist in Capital Markets and Financial Institutions, and at the New Development Bank (NDB) as Head of the Division of Financial Institutions and Markets. In both organizations. she was responsible for supervising programs of Innovative Financing Strategies with local financial institutions and capital markets to promote the financial inclusion and investments of the private sector in low carbon projects and resilience in the region of Latin America and the Caribbean, including in sectors of land use, low carbon agriculture, renewable energy and energy efficiency, resilient and sustainable infrastructure and urban mobility, among others. Maria Netto also worked previously at the United Nations Development Program (UNDP), where she was responsible for supervising global projects to support the capacity building of countries

and civil society to assess investments and financial flows and policy options to integrate green business in different sectors and economic activities. Finally, Maria Netto worked for more than 10 years at the secretariat of the Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC), where, among others, she was responsible for leading the work of the institution in bilateral and multilateral financial cooperation, for the evaluation and monitoring of investments and financial flows to address climate change and the development of carbon market mechanisms under the Kyoto protocol. She has a master's degree in economics from the Institute of International and Development Studies in Geneva.



#### **Ben Weisman**

Ben Weisman is Executive Director for Capital Mobilization at the Glasgow Financial Alliance for Net Zero (GFANZ), a global coalition of financial institutions committed to supporting the decarbonization of the global economy. He leads GFANZ's work on mobilizing private finance for the net-zero transition in emerging markets and developing economies, including supporting innovative models for public-private cooperation. He also helps lead the secretariat of the World Bank Private Sector Investment Lab on behalf of co-chair Mark Carney, Previously, he led work on innovation, sustainability, and inclusion in financial services at the World Economic Forum and was a management consultant at the Boston Consulting Group (BCG). He began his career at the Federal Reserve Bank of New York, where he covered emerging market financial sectors and worked on international policy strategy. Ben holds an MBA and a Masters in Public Policy from Harvard, and a BA in Public Policy and Environmental Studies from Princeton University.





#### André Corrêa do Lago

Born in 1959. He has a BSc in Economics from Universidade Federal do Rio de Janeiro (1981) and joined the Brazilian foreign service in 1982. As a career diplomat, he has held functions in different areas at headquarters. in Brasília: international organizations, trade promotion. protocol and energy. Abroad, he has been posted to the Brazilian Embassies in Madrid, in Prague, in Washington. in Buenos Aires and to the Brazilian Mission to the EU in Brussels. He has been working with the sustainable development agenda since 2001. He was the director of the Energy Department (2008-2011) and of the Environment Department (2011-2013) at the Brazilian Ministry of Foreign Affairs. In the latter period, he was Brazil's chief negotiator for climate change and for the Rio+20 Conference. He was the Brazilian ambassador to Japan (2013-2018), to India (2018-2023) and to Bhutan (2019-2023). Since March 2023, he is the Secretary for Climate, Energy and Environment at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. Corrêa do Lago is the author of several books and articles on sustainable development and climate change, as well as on architecture.





#### **André Clark**

André Clark is Senior Vice President of Siemens Energy in Latin America. Vice President of Siemens Energy Brasil. Siemens Gamesa CEO for the Onshore business in Latin America and Managing Director for Siemens Gamesa in Brazil, having previously been President and CEO of Siemens Brazil and also CEO of ACCIONA for Brazil, Bolivia, Uruguay and Paraguay. André was born in São Paulo and began his career in the Pulp & Paper industry in 1995. With 17 years of experience in Energy. Oil & Gas, Manufacturing, Logistics and Infrastructure segments. André holds a degree in Chemical Engineering from the University of São Paulo (USP) and an MBA in Finance and Operations Management from Stern School of Business, New York University. With an active role in leading associations and entities from different business segments, he is present in the most important discussions about Brazil. #### **Anirban Sarma**

Anirban Sarma is a Deputy Director and Senior Fellow at the Observer Research Foundation, India. He is presently the Lead Co-Chair of the T20 Brazil Taskforce on 'Inclusive Digital Transformation', and was earlier a Chair of the T20 India Task Force on 'Our Common Digital Future'. Anirban's work focuses on the use of technology for sustainable development, the digital economy, and the media. His research has explored issues around digital public infrastructure, data governance, digital health, online safety, and women's empowerment, among other areas.
